Every year YouthGrow supports up to 30 young people coping with personal challenges, to gain real work experience, build learning skills, develop self esteem and establish positive behaviours that will greatly increase their capacity to succeed in life. And they achieve a nationally recognised qualification.

With an 80% success rate, YouthGrow is making a real difference to the lives of young people in Dunedin.

"You kept telling me I could do it and now I'm so proud to have accomplished a certificate – it's been an awesome experience," Level One graduate Hayden Phipps told YouthGrow staff and volunteers at the December graduation ceremony.

For graduate Mark Calvo the highlights were numerous. "I've changed a lot. My language has improved and I'm more aware of my temper and how to control it," he said. "Now I try to work things out for myself and respect those around me."

Staff and volunteers experienced in social work, plant propagation, education, marketing and sales work closely with YouthGrow participants to support their individual needs. It is a unique and very personal programme aimed at helping young people to be "life ready – work ready". It works.

With many young people in Dunedin facing social and physical barriers to joining the "mainstream" and getting ahead in life, demand for participation in YouthGrow is high.

Family Works -Walking Alongside Families

It's no longer appropriate to work just with an individual family member; every member of the family needs to join the walk towards a happier, healthier future.

"That's the focus for our Family Works' services right across Otago," says Paul Hooper, Director of Family Works at Presbyterian Support Otago.

"When a child struggles with life and we're asked to help then we need to address the whole family situation and support each member so together they become a stronger unit. Children are quick to pick up on family anxiety and only collective input from our various services can ensure the right outcome is secured."

Paul was commenting on the complexity of issues many families face today including the sudden loss or reduction in working hours, financial stress, teenagers unable to find work, children subjected to bullying, caring for elderly parents and anxiety around just 'keeping up'.


"Not all families are seeing the economic improvement other regions are experiencing. A number of Otago businesses are laying off staff, placing increasing pressure on our foodbank, budgeting and advocacy services." he said. "Added to that is the fact some helping agencies have withdrawn services because of funding issues, so Family Works is picking up the slack. It's getting really tough."

Budgeting advice and programmes, funded by donations, is a growing area of need.

"For families unfamiliar with struggling on a benefit, the humility they feel can easily spin off into anxiety, depression and sometimes violence, so it's essential we respond quickly and holistically to arrest greater problems and complexities before they develop."

"Understanding and managing the issues within a family ensures the best outcome for children. Very often, something that appears unrelated, like budgeting advice for parents, is the support a child needs for a happier home environment," Paul said.

This is why Family Works staff and volunteers work with whole families to bring about better outcomes for children.
